SETTING THE SCENE

• The SMU Mustangs open **Conference USA play** on the road in Birmingham, Ala., as they take on the 1-0 UAB Blazers at Legion Field.

• The game is first of three straight road games for SMU, which does not return home to Gerald J. Ford Stadium for **35 days**.

• SMU running back **Shawnbrey McNeal** enters the game ranked fourth in the nation with a 158 yard-per-game rushing average.

• The game will feature the Offensive and Defensive Conference USA Players of the Week. SMU safety **Rock Dennis** was named C-USA Defensive Player of the Week on Monday, becoming the first Mustang to earn that honor since Adrian Haywood won the award on Oct. 2, 2006, and UAB's Joe Webb was tabbed the C-USA Offensive Player of the Week.

• SMU snapped a 14-game road losing streak at UAB in 2005 and enters Saturday's game looking for its first C-USA win since Nov. 18, 2006 (vs. Tulsa, 34-24), its first C-USA road win since Sept. 30, 2006 (at Tulane, 33-28) and its first road-opening win since Oct. 13, 2001 (at San Jose St., 24-17).

ABOUT UAB

• UAB is led by junior do-it-all quarterback Joe Webb. In the season-opening, 44-24 win over Rice, Webb was 12-of-15 passing for 221 yards and two scores and also rushed 20 times for 194 yards and two more TDs.

THE SERIES

• SMU and UAB have met just twice on the gridiron, and SMU has won both meetings - 28-27 in Birmingham in 2005 and 22-9 in Dallas in 2006.

THE COACHES

• **June Jones** is in his second season at the SMU helm. His SMU record is 2-11 and his career mark is now 78-52. Jones went 76-41 in nine seasons at Hawaii, leading the Warriors to the All-State Sugar Bowl in 2007. Prior to heading to Hawaii, Jones had a 12-year coaching career in the NFL, including head coaching stops at Atlanta and San Diego.

• June Jones is 1-0 all-time against UAB, as his Hawaii Warriors defeated the Blazers, 59-40, in the 2004 Hawaii Bowl.

• UAB is led by Neil Callaway, who is in his third year at the Blazers' helm. He is 7-18 in two-plus seasons in Birmingham.

LAST TIME VS. UAB

DALLAS - Justin Willis threw for 148 yards and one touchdown and linebacker Tony Hawkins returned an interception for another score as SMU defeated UAB 22-9 on Thursday, Oct. 31, 2006.

Willis, who completed 18-of-23 passes, hit Vincent Chase on a 3-yard touchdown pass with 1:38 left in the first half for a 7-3 SMU lead. It was Chase's first career TD catch.

After UAB took a 9-7 lead on a 40-yard field goal by Swayze Waters with 13:57 left in the game, James Mapps scored on a 30-yard run with 7:37 left and Cedrick Dorsey caught a twice-tipped Willis pass for the 2-point conversion and a 15-9 SMU lead.

Hawkins sealed the game after he intercepted a Chris Williams pass and returned it 11 yards for a touchdown with 2:34 left in the game.

UAB failed to score a touchdown on four drives that reached inside the SMU 25-yard line and had to settle for a 25- and 26-yard field goals by Waters in the first half as well as a 37-yard attempt that drifted wide left in the third quarter.

The Mustangs' first score was set up after an offside penalty on UAB linebacker Mastaki Smith on Thomas Morstead's 31-yard field goal attempt gave SMU a first down at the UAB 9-yard line. Three plays later, Willis connected with Chase.

THE LEGEND AT LEGION

On Oct. 8, 2005, SMU and UAB's first meeting provided one of the most exciting finishes in recent Mustang football history.

Down 27-22, SMU took possession on its own 20-yard-line with 23 seconds left. Mustang QB Jerad Romo quickly completed a 20-yard pass to Bobby Chase, an 8-yarder to DeMyron Martin and 19-yarder to Reynaldo Pellerin to put the Mustangs on the UAB 31-yard line with three seconds to play.

As the final seconds ticked off, Romo lofted a pass toward the left corner of the end zone. UAB had several defenders in the area, but Chase came down with the ball for a 31-yard touchdown as time expired to give SMU a stunning 28-27 victory.

SMU players stormed the field in celebration, while several UAB players fell to the turf in disbelief. SMU took a knee on the extra point, with no time left on the clock.

DON'T STOP BO-LEVI-N'

In 2008, quarterback **Bo Levi Mitchell** became the first true freshman to start at QB for SMU since 2003, but the Katy native showed why June Jones handed him the reins to the Run-and-Shoot.

In his collegiate debut, Mitchell threw for three touchdowns at Rice. Against Texas State, he was 24-of-37 for 370 yards with five TDs and no INTs. The five TD passes tied for second-most all-time in a game at SMU and the 370 passing yards were 13th all-time. At UCF, Mitchell threw a 94-yard TD pass to Aldrick Robinson, which ranks as the second-longest pass play in SMU history.

On the season, Mitchell had 24 TD passes, which was third-most in a season at SMU, and four 300-yard games, which tied for second-most in a season at SMU (record is six by Chuck Hixson in 1968).

FOR PETE'S SAKE!

During 2008 spring drills, SMU linebacker **Pete Fleps** was leaving his apartment for a 6 a.m. workout when he noticed a smoke alarm going off and smoke in a neighboring apartment. He knocked on the front door, and getting no response, tried the handle. It was unlocked, so he opened the door to discover a room filled with heavy smoke. He called out to see if anyone was home, but no one replied. He then located the source of the smoke - a red-hot pan on a stove burner, turned it off, and moved the smoking pan outside. He then looked for occupants and found a mostly unresponsive female in a bedroom. He alerted her, then opened all the windows. Concerned for her privacy, he notified female neighbors and asked them to come over to attend to the woman. With the fire danger gone and the situation under control, Fleps hurriedly went on his way, making sure to arrive at the workout on time.

Fleps led the team with 106 tackles in 2008 - 32 more than SMU's No. 2 tackler. Against Navy, Fleps notched 23 tackles, which ranks as the fourth-most ever in a game by a Conference USA player. He's also a standout in the classroom and was one of 14 players named to the 2008 Conference USA Football All-Academic Team.

GRIDIRON GRADS

SMU student-athletes excel in the classroom, as a remarkable 96 percent of the scholarship student-athletes who entered SMU between 1992 and 2002 and exhausted their eligibility at SMU earned degrees.

Football student-athletes play a big part of SMU's academic success, as 26 players made the Conference USA Commissioner's Honor Roll and three won Commissioner's Academic Medals in 2008-09. In addition, SMU's **Mitch Enright** and **Pete Fleps** were selected to the 14-man C-USA All-Academic Team and Enright and Thomas Morstead made the *ESPN The Magazine* Academic All-District Football Team.

As a team, SMU won the American Football Coaches Association's 2006 Academic Achievement Award after recording a 100 percent graduation rate. Although it was the Mustangs' first win, SMU has been named to the honorable mention category 11 times.

In 2009, SMU has three student-athletes on the roster that have already received degrees - **Mitch Enright**, **Chase Kennemer** and **Mario Walker**.

TRIBUTE 23

Chris Banjo has been awarded the number "23" for the 2009 season. Last spring, Head Coach June Jones announced that starting in 2009, a deserving student-athlete on the SMU football team would be chosen to wear the number "23" on his jersey throughout the season to honor **Jerry LeVias** for his contributions to America, the sport of football and SMU.

When Jerry LeVias started as an end for SMU in a September 24, 1966, game against Illinois, he forever changed the Southwest Conference. LeVias was the first African-American to receive an athletic scholarship in the SWC. Born in Beaumont, Texas, Jerry had played quarterback for Hebert High School. He was small (5-9, 177 lbs.), but made up for it with his great speed, as evidenced in three touchdown runs of over 70 yards each in a 21-8 victory over rival Booker T. Washington. At SMU, LeVias made athletic and academic All-America teams and, in 1966, contributed to the Mustangs' first SWC title in 18 years. He still holds three SMU records as a receiver - 15 passes caught in one game (Ohio State, 1968), 213 yards in one game (N.C. State, 1968) and 1,131 yards receiving in a season (1968). He was a consensus All-American in 1968 and was chosen All-SWC in 1966, 1967, and 1968.

Banjo, a native of Sugar Land, Texas, responded in the 2009 season opener, tying for the team lead with 10 tackles and forcing a fumble.

THE RED CARPET

With the arrival of June Jones, SMU may need to install a red carpet in the Mustang locker room as SMU has become "the place to be" in Dallas. Among the celebrities, Mustang legends, pros and former pros that have attended practice or stopped by the stadium are: Roger Staubach, Troy Aikman, Daryl "Moose" Johnston, Terrell Owens, Jeff George, Reggie Dupard, Eric Dickerson, Craig James, Jerry Ball, Devin Hester, Adam "Pacman" Jones and Deion Sanders.

BIG MAC

SMU running back **Shawnbrey McNeal** is eligible to play immediately, the NCAA ruled on Sept. 4. McNeal had transferred to SMU last spring after spending two seasons at Miami. SMU had submitted the waiver request, which will allow him to play in 2009 as opposed to sitting out the traditional one season, and the Dallas native was granted the exemption based on mitigating personal circumstances.

The 5-10, 190 lb. junior back responded by rushing for a career-high 158 yards on 19 carries. McNeal sealed the win with a 49-yard TD run in the game's closing minutes. It marked the first 150-yard rushing game for an SMU player since DeMyron Martin had 171 against Rice in 2005. McNeal currently ranks fourth in the nation and second in C-USA with his 158 yards-per-game average.

ON THE ROAD AGAIN...

SMU is getting used to life on the road after the season opener. After playing at home on Sept. 5, the Mustangs play three straight road games and do not return home until an Oct. 10 meeting with East Carolina. The **35-day "vacation"** is tied for the third-longest such streak in the FBS (UAB - 37 days, Hawaii - 36 days, Washington St. & Middle Tennessee St. - 35 days).

CENTER OF ATTENTION

SMU junior center **Mitch Enright** is gaining notice both on and off the field. Enright is a two-time member of the Rimington Trophy Watch List, which is awarded to the nation's top center, and was named the 2009 Anson Mount Scholar/Athlete as part of the 53rd-annual Playboy Preseason All-America football team.

Enright graduated with a 3.99 GPA as a management major in three years and is now enrolled in SMU's prestigious Cox School of Business, pursuing his MBA. He is a two-time member of the *ESPN The Magazine* Academic All-District Football Team and a Conference USA Academic Medal winner.

EMMANUEL LABOR

Emmanuel Sanders continues to work his way up the SMU receiving record lists.

Sanders had 958 yards and nine TDs in 2008 and now ranks as SMU's all-time leader in TD catches (27). He also ranks in SMU's all-time top two in career yards (2,518/2nd) and catches (195/2nd at SMU/10th in C-USA history). He holds SMU records for career 100-yard-receiving games with 10, season 100-yard games with six (2008) and is the first player in SMU history to record three 600-yard receiving seasons.

In 2007, he was an honorable mention All-C-USA selection by the league's coaches after catching 74 passes for 889 yards and nine TDs on the year.

The Bellville native caught TD passes in six straight games in 2006, breaking a 29-year-old SMU record for consecutive games with a TD catch.

He added a new wrinkle to his game in the 2009 season opener, returning a punt 79 yards for a touchdown against SFA. The punt return TD was the first for SMU since Blake Warren scored from 63 yards out against Rice in 2003.

THE MCCANN CANN

Don't tell SMU defensive back and return man **Bryan McCann** that there's something he can't do.

The Oklahoma City native had open heart surgery at the age of two and was not supposed to play any sports as he grew up. He was then hit by a car at the age of six and had hernia surgery at the age of nine. If that wasn't enough, he broke his leg and ankle in the fall of his senior year of high school. McCann defied all the odds and naysayers, though, and came back to win the state title in the 100-yard dash and earn C-USA All-Freshman honors in 2006 at SMU.

HERE'S TO YOU, MR. ROBINSON

SMU junior receiver **Aldrick Robinson** has speed to burn. Not long into spring drills, Coach June Jones singled Robinson out as a future star. Robinson has proved Jones right, hauling in 11 TD catches in 2008, which is tied for the most ever in a season at SMU, and ranking sixth in the nation with 104.7 receiving yards per game. With 1,047 yards on the year, he became just the third player in SMU history to record a 1,000-yard season and had a streak of five straight games with a receiving TD.

He had four 100-yard games in 2008, including a 210-yard effort at UCF - the second-highest total ever in a game at SMU - and a 186-yard game against Houston - the third-highest total in school history. He also set another mark against UCF, pulling down a 94-yard TD reception, which ranks as the second-longest pass play in SMU history.

He enters 2008 as one of 37 players on the "Watch List" for the 2009 Biletnikoff Award, which recognizes the top wide receiver in college football.

THE DYNAMIC DUO

The wide receiver duo of **Aldrick Robinson** and **Emmanuel Sanders** finished 2008 ranked as the nation's No. 3 receiving tandem with 200.5 yards per game. They are also mounted quite an assault on SMU's tandem receiving records.

SMU redshirt freshman defensive end **Margus Hunt** is not your average rookie. He has been enrolled at SMU since fall of 2007 but is in his first year of playing football. His only football experience until now consisted of playing Madden NFL video games.

While his experience level could be questioned, his athleticism will not be. Hunt won gold medals in both the shot and the discus at the 2006 World Junior Championships in Beijing, becoming the first junior athlete ever to win a shot/discus gold medal double.

He still trains with Dave Wollman, SMU's world-renowned throwing coach, and hopes to represent Estonia in the 2012 Olympics in London.

SMU's roster includes four 100m track champions from three different states. Senior **Bryan McCann** won the Oklahoma state title in 2006, junior **Aldrick Robinson** won a Texas state crown in 2007, junior **Shawnbrey McNeal** was a two-time 3A Texas state champ and sophomore **B.J. Lee** won the Mississippi state championship in 2008.

SMU offers live video streaming of its home football games. While we're not the first school to do so, SMU has always been on the cutting edge of the world wide web. SMU partnered with Broadcast.com to broadcast the first college football game (SMU 17, Arkansas 14) over the Internet on Sept. 2, 1995.

WHAT A DIFFERENCE A YEAR MAKES!

Entering the 2008 season, SMU was the youngest team in the nation with 17 true freshmen listed on the two-deep. While the Mustangs are still young in 2009, with 32 freshmen or sophomores on the 55-man two-deep, only three are true freshmen.

THE NFL CONNECTION

Five of SMU's 10 football coaches have either played or coached in the NFL - **Head Coach June Jones** and assistant coaches **Joe Haering**, **Bert Hill**, **Adrian Klemm** and **Dennis McKnight**. In addition, two more assistants - **Tom Mason** and **Jeff Reinebold** - coached in NFL Europe and the Canadian Football League and offensive graduate assistant **Carlos Barocio-Leon** was a head coach in the European Leagues, winning two Eurobowl Titles (XIV & XV).

HAIL TO THE CHIEF!

Former **President George W. Bush** visited SMU football practice on August 24th. Bush was joined by SMU President R. Gerald Turner and the former president briefly addressed the players after the practice session.

Coach June Jones had given the 43rd President a practice schedule and asked him to stop by and speak to the team when he could. Mr. Bush watched about an hour of drills and even put on a red SMU hat for part of his stay.

"He said he's an SMU rookie, it's his first year," Coach Jones said.

Jones later Tweeted, "(The President) talked to the guys and told them he will be supporting SMU and Dallas for the years to come."

The Mustang Legend

Legend has it that when Ford Motor Company was preparing to introduce the sports car that would gain fame as the Mustang, it was considering other names such as Cougar, Bronco, Cheetah and Colt.

But during the 1963 football season, SMU took an undersized but quick team to Ann Arbor to play a massive Michigan Wolverine squad. Michigan gained the early advantage, but had to fight off the feisty Ponies for a 27-16 win.

After the game, Ford's Lee Iacocca entered the SMU locker room and addressed the disappointed Mustangs.

"Today," Iacocca said, "After watching the SMU Mustangs play with such flair, we reached a decision. We will call our new car the Mustang. Because it will be light, like your team. It will be quick, like your team. And it will be sporty, like your team."

Ford's new car got its name, and the rest, as they say, is history.
